

1. Double Storey Chocolate Box (+-1857)  
Anderson built the house. Dates from 1850's and has fine sash windows, this was the home of the lamp-lighter when the streets were still lit with carbide.
2. Applewood/Grasdak Huis (+-1850)  
The two cottages at no.26 & 28 Victoria street date from the earliest settlement in Uniondale.
3. Synagogue (1903)  
Built by Zelich Shear. The Jewish community was well established in Uniondale in the late eighteen hundreds and the leader of the local community was a shopkeeper, bottle-store owner and farmer called Shear who had emigrated from Russia with his large family, and who was chiefly responsible for founding the congregation and building the synagogue.
4. Voortrekker Hall (built 1862)  
First N.G Church
5. Jewish Cemetery - Lionville
6. Apostolic Church (1843-1943)
7. Court House/Police station (1891)  
The public buildings in the Italianate style were built in 1891 and formally housed the Post Office in the premises now occupied by the Police.
8. First National Bank (built 1914) not in service anymore
9. Attorney's Office (+-1894)
10. Pastorie Revamped 1906 & 1956
11. All Saints Church (1876) The Anglican church consecrated in 1876 is the oldest place of worship still in use in Uniondale.
12. Standard Bank (built 1906). The bank started business in 1881, but closed down 1884 and reopened 1902, moved to handsome premises in 1906.
13. Blacksmith - See horse tatoos on door
14. Anglican Graveyard  
British soldiers killed 18 Aug 1901
15. The Dutch Reformed Church (built 1884)  
Design by the celebrated ecclesiastical architect, Haage (DRS Ladysmith, Moerderkerk Stellenbosch) it is not known whether he visited Uniondale. The new tower was built in 1908. The church was enhanced by a stone "ringmuur" in 1926. Otto Hager designed Dutch Reformed Church in 1866.
16. Nagmaal huisies.
17. Cold drink Factory - wooden building
18. Royal Hotel (built 1899-1900) not in service anymore
19. Bon Accord  
First Bioscope in Uniondale and now a guest house.  
First built as a roller-skate hall
20. Watermill (built 1854)  
Built by James Stewardt. This mill has the largest wheel in the southern Hemisphere, it is now a national monument, it was restored in 1975 and again by Robert Verwoerd in 1997, he now runs a restaurant and art gallery from here.
